Final Chairman's Report

The Priory Singers were founded, if my information is correct, some forty or so years ago as an evening class running at Wyndham School in Egremont, led by Hugh Turpin.

It then continued to meet in the Old College Hall every week with a full turnout of some 25-30 people including a good complement of all four voices.

The range of music enjoyed was quite considerable, with Hugh Turpin's own compositions featuring on the programme: who does not remember his Catullus songs?

The Christmas programme of music and readings in the Priory was a fixed point each December: Tom Rice was heard to say that Christmas could not really start until our concert had taken place. Until recently there was an annual Choral Evensong performed in the summer for the Friends of the Priory.

People who had heard us then invited us to sing at their own celebrations - many weddings featured both the Singers and compositions by Hugh. We have also sung our farewells to members of the Singers who had passed away.

We have joined in larger groups to perform concerts, for example the recent performance of Fauré's Requiem.

Latterly, when Hugh became ill, Frank Bowler very kindly took over as musical director and enabled us to sing standards and lighter items.

In recent times, however, we have lost many friends, some who have moved away and others who have passed away, and so the Priory Singers have become unviable.

I am sure that I speak for all of us when I say that I will take away many happy memories of music shared in a friendly and collaborative atmosphere, and my life has been enriched by the variety of music which I have enjoyed.

Our thanks are due to Hugh, Frank, and everyone who has taken part.

The Acting Bishop of Carlisle, the Rt Rev Rob Saner-Haigh, wrote to the parishes in the Diocese, following the publication of the Makin Report and the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

Dear Friends,

I wanted to write again at the end of this difficult week to say that I continue to hold all of you in my prayers, particularly those who have felt most troubled and pained by the contents of the Makin report and the responses to it.

As we rightly focus on the failings in safeguarding over decades, renewing our resolve not to repeat these and holding in our hearts all victims and survivors, I want especially to acknowledge the hard work and deep commitment of all those in this diocese who are helping to make the church a safer place for all. From people undertaking training to support church activities, to parish safeguarding officers, ministers, clergy, employees and our Diocesan Safeguarding Adviser and Safeguarding Advisory Panel, the work you are doing is vital. It is life protecting and life giving. Thank you so much for all you have done, are doing, and will do.

We have all been affected in different ways by the news of the past week. For some this has brought forward very painful memories, which may still be held in secret. For others, it has caused a crisis of confidence in the institution which they are part of and have given so much to. Some are less affected, whilst others feel deeply discouraged. There will be many different feelings and reactions.

What I want to say might seem inadequate in the face of all this, but it is simply this truth: God heals broken hearts. The church, though a flawed, human institution, is also amazingly a vessel through which our perfect saviour, Jesus, heals today. Though his church may fail too often, Jesus is still sure and true and he still comes to bring hope where it has faded, healing where there is brokenness, and justice for all....

So, please join with me in praying, first and foremost, for those most affected by abuse. Please pray that we might have more of God's heart, wisdom and courage so that we may be that safe haven for all which is our calling.

Please know that I am praying for you. Thank you for your prayers for me.

May God bless you over these coming days, and may God tend to you in whichever way you need.
