December 2023 - January 2024

Each year I look forward to seeing Christmas ads on TV for the first time and as soon as I saw this year's John Lewis commercial online I loved it straight away. For those of you who haven't seen it a boy buys a seed from a second-hand sale believing it to be from a kit for "planting a perfect Christmas tree". He plants it, and it grows into a Venus flytrap. The plant happily grows in the corner of the living room until it tries to eat the boy's dog, table lamp and furnishings, so his family throws it out into the garden.

The family replace the Venus flytrap with a traditional Christmas tree whilst the rejected plant looks in through the patio doors, its trap shaped leaf face squished up against the glass in longing. The little boy reaches out to his flytrap friend, taking a beautifully wrapped present out to the garden and then his family, inspired by kindness, do the same. The Venus flytrap eats the presents, then regurgitates them back up and spits them at the family, helpfully unwrapped.

On the face of it this is a rather unusual Christmas advert - it's not sentimental, cosy or sparkly. It features a giant present eating plant that almost ruins Christmas. But if you look a little deeper I think it has something very profound and honest to say about our annual festivities. A clue can be found in the backing track, a song especially written for this advert, with Andrea Bocelli theatrically repeating the lyrics 'la vita è una festa', meaning 'life is a celebration'.

The church of England's 2023 Christmas campaign is called "Join the Song" and highlights how singing can help draw us closer to God and each other through the journey from Advent to Epiphany; darkness into light. There are songs for every season of the church year, just as there are songs for every season of life, and music throughout December and January has the power to comfort and enlighten us.

Songs learnt in childhood, such as hymns, carols and Christmas songs, often seem to "come back" to those whose memory is failing and can be a source of great comfort and joy. In November we successfully launched our first fortnightly "Memory Cafe" in New College Hall (see page?) The café provides those with memory loss and their carers with a warm and welcoming space to meet and chat. Our December gathering will include a few carols too.

It might seem that Andrea Bocelli singing 'life is a celebration' and a Venus flytrap disrupting Christmas don't fit together but Christmas always has been a tale of the unexpected. On the very first Christmas Day a heavenly host of angels frightened a bunch of shepherds witless with their heavenly song about a child born to save the world. The shepherds search for the child and find that the he is not a king in a palace but a baby lying in an animal's feeding trough. There was nothing sentimental, cosy or sparkly about this Christmas Day.

The apostle Paul wrote to the early church "May the God of hope fill you with joy and peace" (Romans 15:13). My prayer is similar, that despite whatever comes our way, we might be able to say, in the words of Andrea Bocelli, 'la vita è una festa' - 'life is a celebration'.

Parish Council News

Flooding- there continue to be serious problems with flooding on the Outrigg to Egremont Road. The Parish Council is pressing Highways for a solution to be found as a matter of urgency. Several vehicles have become stuck in the flooded section or have been damaged by debris in the water. Highways officers have assured us that discussions are taking place with parties involved but the Parish Council is very concerned that the situation could worsen if the water spread by vehicles driving through the flooded section were to ice over during cold weather. Cumberland Council has erected barriers and improved the signage but this cannot be a long term solution.

Remembrance Sunday – The usual parade and wreath laying ceremony took place on Sunday 12 November to mark Remembrance Sunday. The wreaths from the local organisations were on display in the window of 22 Main Street in the days leading up to Remembrance Sunday. The parade was very well attended by local people with representatives of a number of organisations laying wreaths at the war memorial.

Christmas tree -the Parish Council has once again provided a large tree for the village. By the time this magazine is published the tree should be in place on Cross Hill. Thank you to all those who have volunteered to help with putting up the tree and lights or help with the Santa Parade on 28 November.

Full Fibre Broadband – Work is set to take place shortly to instal the infrastructure to provide full fibre broadband across the local area. This is part of a government funded project and will make use of existing poles as well as installing some underground cables. The work will be carried out by Viberoptix. The Parish Council has granted a wayleave agreement to allow cabling to be laid under the lonning behind the former Station garage as part of the work required. The work is likely to take place in the next few months.

Next Parish Council Meeting – The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday 18 December at 6.30pm in the Village Hall with the January meeting taking place on Monday 15 January 2024. All Council meetings are open to the public and all residents are welcome to attend.

In the meantime the Parish Council would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

Well, St. Bees ghosts and hauntings

.... To the several readers who have enquired, I can only apologise for this late and inadequate answer. Old St. Bees seems never to have been greatly troubled by the supernatural, and the few stories that have come down the years to us, strike me as barely credible. Maybe my problem with ghoulies and ghosties is that I cannot believe in any of them.

Of course there have always been folk around with opinions quite opposite. Yet even the excellent memoir left us by Town Head Farmer John Sewell advises a pinch of salt with much that he tells. Having grown up in Victorian times at How Man at the South of the village, Sewell could relate what was commonly believed of *"How Man Hop"*. She was a female ghost whose head had been removed in life, who was nevertheless able to appear on dark nights roaming anywhere in the area. According to Jonathan Herd and Jackson Flemming, both village worthies, she would appear suddenly and silently, floating as though weightless over walls and ditches without ever touching them. Something of a feat, because all the while she cradled her severed head as if precious, in her arms.

Long after John Sewell's time, I was told a different story linked to How Man. An elderly village lady of undoubted integrity repeated for me her old grandmother's assertion that strange things still happened there. According to the grandmother, a quarry -worker (whose Biblical-sounding forename she could not recall) had been walking home one winter evening after his day's work had finished.

Alone on the dark How Man road, he suddenly became aware that someone - or some thing uncannily silent - was following closely behind him. Even before daring to look back, he somehow knew what it was. With horror he knew it to be the ghost of his wife's uncle, even though he had seen that uncle hale and hearty that very morning. But on rushing home he found the uncle dead there, having collapsed suddenly that afternoon. Only then did the workman recognise the unwanted part he had been made to play - that of leading the ghost to where the dispossessed body awaited it.

Of course it is hard to find real evidence in matters of this sort. Perhaps it is relevant that at around the right time St. Bees had two workmen with biblical-sounding forenames – one an Elijah and the other a Joshua. But I have found nothing to link either to How Man. Jonathan Herd, however, is well documented: a significant figure in village life with a desirable property at the end Main Street, his occupation given as 'house proprietor'.

There may be other tales of hauntings in St. Bees, but I have heard of nothing at all substantial. Once there was a barn on High House road which choirboys were afraid to pass. On winter evenings after Practice the Priory organist is known to have escorted them past it. Also, too, a ghost was said to pass sometimes between the Priory graveyard and the Public School. I wonder whether one of the Old Boys might elucidate?


